# The Green:

Chris Dieter, Course Superintendent:

Through July, this year was looking to be wetter than last year. August and September have been dry months. We had 0.45 inches of rain for September, which is more than other golf courses in this area. We have used 12,102,332 gallons for irrigation this month alone. Many hours have been dedicated to checking and repairing sprinklers and control boxes. (picture: below right: Mark Clem works on a sprinkler head at #14 Rock green.) There are approximately 144 sprinklers that have not been used since before I became your Superintendent. The 144 sprinklers were brought back into operation during September. You may have seen sprinklers running from hoses; these are keeping grass alive in areas where we have no irrigation.



Recently we had Milan and Marie Majarov come to tag monarch butterflies. Their visit helps with research done through the University of Kansas' monarch watch program. Once we have the tagging numbers I will post them if anyone is interested in following their progress.


Monarch butterflies have declined by over 90%. Through the *Monarchs in the rough program* golf courses all over the US are providing habitat for their survival.
