Ask Denny:

What is the most unique hole at Rock Harbor?

The article in December's newsletter about "What is The Most Unique Golf Hole?" at Rock Harbor was an answer to conversations with members about unique holes at Rock Harbor. What is unique to members who play here all the time is different from someone asking the question as an outsider to Rock Harbor. This article is in direct response to print publications who have the same question.

Golf magazines like to use the word 'unique' because it entices their readers into thinking they are going to read about a golf hole they have never heard about or seen before.

I often used the word unique while building Rock Harbor so that I would remind myself that I wanted no two holes to look alike or play alike. Because of that very thinking process some of the holes turned out to be very unique. I would even go so far as to say, you will not find certain holes, like the ones at Rock Harbor, anywhere else.

A few of the unique holes at Rock Harbor are: Number 7 Rock, the island green; Number 10 Rock, with a split fairway and bunker in the middle; Number 12 Rock with the Bowl Green; Number 13 Rock with a green that's eighty-seven yards long; Number 15 Rock with alternate routes; Number 16 Rock with all its special features; And last, don't forget Rock Number 17, because of the tees being highly elevated so you can see the perfectly shaped heart green surrounded by bunkers. We have not even talked about the Boulder Course, let's save that for another article.
