"Not everything that counts can be counted and not everything that's counted truly counts."


Born in Louisville Kentucky, Amy attended UK, but her time was cut short when her husband of 11 years suddenly

After that he became the GM at Plantation Country Club in Louisville, KY. Her father was like many other golf fathers and had her putting into a drinking glass on the living room floor for fun.

Amy has been very persistent to give her children a world view of life and show them other parts of the globe. She has spent time traveling with each of her children. They have been to The Galapagos Islands, Western Samoa, Costa Rico and in a few days she and her youngest son will be in South Afri-

ca, working with baby hippos. Each of the trips with her kids had a purpose, to better the lives of others not just to vacation in someplace beautiful or exotic.

Amy enjoys an active life away from RH also. She likes to Paddle Board, Garden, Read and spend time with her 3 grand-children.

The smile you see from Amy is true and genuine. She has become quite found of RH and the family she works with, she is also smitten with the members and customers who walk through the doors each day.
