The Harbor Cup 2015

It was a gloomy Friday morning but no weather could stop the competitive atmosphere between the two, I4 player teams, representing this years annual Har-



bor Cup championship. Everyone met at the Ist tee to watch the opening pairing make their way out to the links.

Seven matches took place on Friday starting at 10:00 a.m.. The team captains watched as the pairings they created, teed off in succession to take the early lead on day one.

Day I. Matches I & 2 both resulted in a tie making the score I to I. Matches 3 & 4, the Blue team were victorious giving the Blue team the lead, 3 to I. Before the Blue team could extend the lead, the final match on the course was closed out early in favor of the Red team closing the gap 3 to 2. Soon after, match 5 was closed out in favor of the Red team, making the score an even 3 to 3. That left match 5 last on the course. It was a fight to the 18^{th} hole resulting in a tie. Final score for day one- Blue team $3\frac{1}{2}$, Red team $3\frac{1}{2}$.

Day 2. Alternate shot. That format alone brings fear into competitors and tests your friendships with one another. The matches teed off, only this time, the Blue team in matches I & 2 closed out their competitors after the I4th hole of play. This gives the Blue team the early lead 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$. Match 3 on the other hand, was closed out by the Red team on the I6th green, bringing the score closer 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 $\frac{1}{2}$. Match 4 & 5 however, were won by the Blue team, stretching the lead once more 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 $\frac{1}{2}$. Both matches 6 & 7 battled to the I8th green. Match 6 resulted in a tie and 7 was won by the Red team. This closed play for day 2... Blue team 8 and Red team 6.

Day 3. Tensions were high. Sunday singles were upon us. Every match was head to head and 14 points were up for grabs. As all the matches teed off back to back, anyone could win. The Blue team just needed 6 ½ more points to claim the cup while the Red team needed 8 to retain it. Match one goes the distance to the 18th. Red team wins bringing the score 8 to 7. Something strange happened after that. A fire must have been started under the Blue team. They closed out the next 5 matches before the 17th hole. WOW!! That is some serious playing! Blue team 13, Red team 7. Blue team, needing only 1½ more points, fails to win match 7. Blue team 13, Red team 8. But as soon as Red gets a needed point, Blue team seals the deal winning the next 4, forcing the remaining matches to be conceded. Final tally was a whopping Blue team 20 to Red team 8. 




