Well, spring is finally here! March temperatures are not what I was hoping for after such a mild winter. I have never seen so much golf played in January and February, in Virginia. The warm weather helped the maintenance crew get quite a bit more accomplished. Charging up the irrigation system this year brings a little more excitement as we will be testing out the new irrigation controllers. Rainbird will be in to install the Central

Control Computer and the initial programing in early April. This new system will be eliminating a lot of my headaches as well as improving the efficiency of our irrigation system.

The Crew is continuing to work on cleaning up bunker edges. I am hoping we will be done with the bunker on Boulder #2, pictured below, by the time you are reading this.



Aerification will take place the weeks of April 3<sup>rd</sup> and April 10<sup>th</sup>. The Rock Course starting April 3<sup>rd</sup> and the Boulder Course starting April 10<sup>th</sup>. We moved the dates up this year trying to have the greens heal sooner for prime golf season, however we are always at the mercy of the weather.
