


## Fresh From The Grill

While in the middle of aerifying greens, the obvious topic this month you would think would be something to do with aerification. After watching the maintenance crew work so hard this week, I would like to give credit where credit is due. I have been receiving many compliments about our course conditions. While I appreciate the kind words, I would like to point out the hard work of the maintenance crew. Without their attention to detail, *Rock Harbor* would not be as enjoyable. Try to give them a compliment or thumbs up from time to time.

Summer in Virginia can be very unpredictable, and this summer seems to be no exception. Weeks with no rain, heat, and little

humidity to high temperatures in the mid-eighties, and night temperatures as low as the fifties, add rain and high humidity. All types of conditions raising all types of challenges. Water management is a challenge we face every day, always considering the playability of the course for the members and other customers. Moisture levels affect every aspect of the game, starting with sticking a tee in the ground, the roll of the ball down the fairway, how the greens hold a shot, and the speed of putts. We have made a lot of changes to the way we are watering the course.

You may have noticed Joe Ott hand watering the greens. This process helps us not to overwater some areas of the green while keeping some of the knobs and slopes from drying out. Even the flatter greens require hand watering at times due to localized dry spots. Localized dry spots are areas which develop a soil condition which repels water more than absorbing it. When hand watering we have the ability to add a wetting agent which helps the water penetrate the localized dry spots. Areas such as these are one of the many reasons we aerify the greens twice a year. Joe Ott's efforts in this area have kept the greens in great shape this year.
